### **CHECK IN**

Check-in begins no earlier than 4:00 PM on Friday September 27th. Upon arrival you will enter through the Main Gate and follow the signs. You will be directed to your assigned camping location to unload your equipment. After you are finished immediately move your vehicle to its designated parking area. Only 2 vehicles per group are allowed to unload at a time. You must always have a parking pass displayed on your dashboard where it can be read.

While others unload your camping gear, please send one leader to check in at headquarters with your paperwork and get your event information and wristbands. Units bringing trailers are encouraged to arrive as early as 4:00 PM Friday. This will help speed up arrival for passenger-only cars later in the day. The Main Gate will only be open on Friday and Sunday. If you are arriving on Saturday, please proceed to the second entrance, park in the dirt lot, and enter by the lake.

There is no parking at campsites - all vehicles must be moved to the designated parking areas. Don't hesitate to contact CampEmerson@scouting.org to find accommodations for people with disabilities or other special needs. Please cooperate with all staff when driving around the park. Safety is the highest priority during the event.

### PARKING


#### There is NO PARKING IN CAMPSITES.

All vehicles must be parked in their assigned parking area. You will be given 60 minutes to unload no more than 2 vehicles at a time. You must always have a parking pass displayed on your dashboard where it can be read. Please cooperate with staff who will be coming around to make sure vehicles are moved. Vehicles that are not moved are subject to citation and or towing by the San Bernardino County Sheriff's Department.

- ACCESS ROADS ARE CONSIDERED FIRE LANES.
- VEHICLES CANNOT BE PARKED ON THESE ROADS.
- NO PARKING IS ALLOWED ON THE GRASS.

#### **Preferred Parking:**

If you have purchased preferred parking, you will receive a special parking pass to place in your vehicle at check-in. You will be assigned specific parking in one of three different areas based on where you are camping. A limited number of preferred parking passes may be available upon your arrival.





### **CHECK OUT**

Saturday evening checkout must be arranged in advance with the Adventure Weekend Headquarters Staff. Check out begins Sunday morning between the hours of 8:30 am and 10:00 am. When checking out, units need to send a leader to the Adventure Weekend headquarters when you are almost ready to depart. Before your final departure staff will check the unit's campsites to ensure that "Leave No Trace" conditions have been met.





## WHAT YOU CANNOT BRING

Possession of these or any other illegal, un-Scout like, or unsafe items as determined by the Adventure Weekend Administration is grounds for immediate dismissal from camp. Fires are not allowed at the campsite.

- Cap Guns



### **HEALTH & SAFETY POLICIES**

#### **Youth Protection and Unit Leadership**

The safety of our youth members is our top priority at Adventure Weekend. All Scouts and Leaders are expected to follow the Scout Oath and Law. The California Inland Empire Council, Boy Scouts of America strictly adheres to the Scouter's Code of Conduct, as well as all Youth Protection standards and guidelines. These include, but are not limited to:

- 2-deep leadership
- No one-on-one contact
- Use the Buddy System
- Respect of privacy
- Separate accommodations for youth and adults
- Constructive discipline
- Appropriate attire
- No hazing
- No secret organizations
- No bullying

BSA policy requires two adult leaders, one of whom must be at least 21 years of age, to be in camp for the entire weekend. Likewise, there must be a registered female adult leader 21 years of age or over in every unit serving females. All concerns will be reported to the Adventure Weekend Headquarters area at the park.

#### **Illness and First Aid**

First aid treatment is available 24 hours a day at the Adventure Weekend headquarters

We are guest of the San Bernardino Sheriff's Department. The Glen Helen Regional Park closes at 10:30pm. All Scouts, adults, and leaders are expected to be at their campsite by 10:30 pm. If a Scout, parent, adult, or leader violates curfew, or has disciplinary problems, the San Bernardino County Sheriff's Department may escort them off the premises.



# SECTION II CAMPING INFORMATION



### **CAMPING INFORMATION**

#### Water

Designated water supply areas are limited and may be far from the sub-camps. Each unit is expected to bring sufficient water for drinking, cooking, and cleaning, at least one gallon per person per day is recommended. It is recommended to bring large containers to carry water and wagons or hand trucks to transport them.

#### Meals

Plan basic menus so food preparation does not consume activities. The Adventure weekend Trading Post will have cold drinks and snacks available Friday night and all-day Saturday. Food vendors will be stationed around the Midway area on Saturday from 9:00 am to 4:00 pm only. Order of the Arrow Scouts will also provide a fabulous Pancake Breakfast and delicious dinner, with vegetarian options. The Order of the Arrow meals need to be purchased in advance at iescouts.org/adventure-weekend

#### **Fires**

San Bernardino County Sheriff mandates no open fires. Cooking will be done using propane stoves or burners. Charcoal for Dutch Oven cooking will not be allowed.

#### Tents/Gear

Self-standing tents are recommended. Small stakes are permitted, nothing longer than 1 foot. Safety caps on stakes and flagging on guidelines are strongly encouraged. Tents must be close together. Bring your Unit flag, Stand, Gateway, and Banner.

#### Electricity

Please note that no on-site electricity is available for Scouts, parents, leaders, and Campers. We cannot accommodate any electrical lighting or medical devices. If you require a medical device that uses electricity, you must provide a battery-type power source.



### CAMPING INFORMATION (CONT.)

#### Trash

- All units are expected to keep their campsites clean.
- Each unit is required to bring its trash bags.
- Drain all liquids before putting them in trash bags.
- Separate recyclables (items with CRV glass, aluminum, plastic bottles, and cans) from the trash.
- Put recyclables in large light blue plastic bags. Put trash in large clear or black trash bags.
- Leave enough space at the top of each bag to double-knot the bag's opening.
- If the bag breaks, re-bag and again double-knot it!
- Check all bathrooms for cleanliness and to ensure trash has been emptied.
- Put ALL bags at the roadway edge of the troop's grassy camp area.
- Any miscellaneous items of trash (discarded tents, lawn chairs, boxes, etc.) must be put to one side of the pile of trash bags.

#### Uniforms

The Adventure Weekend 2024 staff encourages Scouts and Scouters to wear Adventure Weekend T-shirts or Scout uniforms. We encourage you to wear the uniform shirt, shorts, or pants to the opening ceremony and the pack, troop, or crew activity uniform during the day.

#### **Friday Night Dance Party**

We will host a Friday night glow dance party for Scouts and everyone to enjoy so please bring your neon clothes and paint to glow and dance the night away.

#### Saturday Morning Opening Ceremony

The San Bernardino Sheriff will help us with an exciting opening flag ceremony. There is no driving in the park during this time for safety reasons. Please be on time for the opening ceremony and follow all the instructions provided for your safety.

#### Adventure Zones in the Midway

These areas feature hands-on activities for all scouts. Keep checking the Adventure Weekend website iescouts.org/adventure-weekend for updates for more things to do here this year.

#### **Community Showcase in the Midway**

Community organizations that support the Scouting program will have booths in this area.

#### Merit Badge Academy

#### **Cub Scout Adventures**

Saturday Cub Scout programs will include opportunities to earn Bob Cat Adventures, participate in the conservation projects to earn Champions of Nature, or work on your Cub Scout Fishing Adventures at the lake.

#### Competitions

Each sub-camp will have a campsite competition with first, second, and third-place awards. Interested units should set up their campsite in full by 10:00 am Saturday. Judging criteria will be reviewed at the pre camp Zoom meeting. Judging will begin Saturday after the opening ceremonies and awards will be presented during the closing campfires.

#### **Trading Post**

The Adventure Weekend Trading Post will have an assortment of items that campers tend to forget or not bring enough of. Additionally, they will have Adventure Weekend T-shirts, safe and affordable knives, snacks and sweets (including some healthy options). And a large selection of ice-cold drinks!

The Trading Post accepts cash and most major credit cards.





### EVENT INFORMATION (CONT.)

#### The Rodeo

All Scouts and Scouters are invited to attend the "Saddle Up" rodeo qualifications free of charge on Saturday morning at 8:30 am. You must be at the Adventure weekend Headquarters at 8:30 am to walk over to the Rodeo with the Sheriff escort. "Saddle Up" events usually consist of watching contestants qualify for their spot for the weekend's rodeo events, seeing behind the scenes, and potential cowboy guest speakers. It is not open to the public. No one will be permitted in the viewing area without a wristband. For all other shows, tickets are available for purchase through the San Bernardino County Sheriff 's Department.

#### Water Park and Water Slides

The water park will be open on Saturday from 8:30 am – 5:00 pm. Everyone who registers prior to August 31st will get free access to the water park. You will be assigned a scheduled time for the water park. Anyone can enjoy the wading pool or splash pad; however you must be at least 48" tall to ride the waterslides. A limited number of water park wrist bands may be available upon check in

#### **Service Projects**

There will be several opportunities for service projects for conservation hours at Adventure Weekend. Saturday trail maintenance and planting, and Sunday morning park cleanup





### EVENT INFORMATION (CONT.)

#### **OA** Island

OA Island offers Cubs Scouts, Scouts BSA, parents and siblings alike, the opportunity to learn more about Native American culture. Come into our Teepee to learn about regalia and other interesting accouterments and sit inside to hear stories of old by our Arrowmen. Come hear the beat of the drum, make a necklace, and learn to dance on the OA Island. OA Ceremony Drumming & Dancing Demonstrations will be all day.

#### **Closing Campfires**

On Saturday evening, units will mobilize near their sub-camp and begin their march to the closing campfire. Units should plan to walk together. A special, totem, light, or flag is useful for keeping the unit together, especially after dark. Scouts and Scouters will sit on the grass for the entire show. A blanket or ground cloth will be useful to mark and cushion your area. No chairs for youth are allowed at the show. Performances that excite and inspire will be featured on the stage, as well as award ceremonies for campsite judging and other competitions.





### EVENT INFORMATION (CONT.)

#### Fishing

The lake at Glen Helen Regional Park will be opened to the Scouts this year for fishing. Bring your pole and work on Cub Scout fishing Adventures or your Scouts BSA fishing Merit Badge. Participants over 16 years old will require and Valid California State Fishing License.

#### **Shooting Sports**

The following Range and Target Sports will take place Saturday from 8:30 am – 5:00 pm. Units will be assigned a scheduled time for their assigned activity.

**CUB SCOUTS** - BB Gun Shooting, and or Archery will be offered at the Cub Scout Shooting Sports ranges and are for registered Cub Scouts ONLY. You are not guaranteed to get to participate in each activity, activity slots will be assigned by registration date and unit size.

**SCOUTS BSA** - Archery and Tomahawks will be offered at the Scout Range. Range activities are subject to availability and may be canceled at any time. Non-Scout siblings may not participate in Shooting Sports activities.





### TRAINING AT ADVENTURE WEEKEND



#### **IOLS Introduction to Outdoor Leadership Skills**

IOLS is a required training course for Scoutmasters and Assistant Scoutmasters in Scouts BSA Troops. Learn how to safely conduct outdoor activities. Participants must camp for the weekend. Saturday Lunch is included in the registration. Before the training at Adventure Weekend, we will hold a Zoom meeting to cover the classroom portions of the training. The date and time for this meeting are still being finalized



#### **BALOO Basic Adult Leader Outdoor Orientation**

BALOO is required for at least one adult is a Cub Scout pack that wants to go overnight camping. The training helps leaders plan events that are fun and rooted in Cub Scouting principles, and that keep their Scouts safe and entertained. Participants must camp for the weekend. Saturday Lunch is included in the registration. Before the training at Adventure Weekend, we will hold a Zoom meeting to cover the classroom portions of the training. The date and time for this meeting are still being finalized



#### CPR / AED / First Aid

Sign up for CPR, First Aid, AED training & certification. Two sessions offered. Saturday morning or afternoon. Limited spaces available. Registration includes access to Adventure Weekend
