At the recent Mt. Rubidoux District Roundtable, attendees were treated to an outstanding presentation by Semper Fi 1, who shared their deep knowledge and passion for the United States flag.

Their program covered the history of the American flag, from its earliest designs to the modern Stars and Stripes, highlighting how it has come to represent freedom, unity, and sacrifice. Troubleshooting Scoutbook Filter Issues

If you're having trouble accessing information in Scoutbook, it might be due to the new Filter feature. Sometimes this filter can get "stuck" and prevent data from showing properly.


Here's what to check:

- Look for the Filter settings (see photos for reference).
- Make sure to clear the filter if it seems stuck or isn't showing results.
- For the Filter to work correctly, ensure that at least one item is selected in each of these sections:
 - Registrants
 - Renewal Status
 - Registration Status

Without at least one selection in each category, Scoutbook won't display any information.

Hope this helps resolve your access issues!

Scoutbook Plus is moving away from connections-based permissions and moving toward position-based permissions, which will provide greater performance and permission customization.

In Scoutbook Legacy, permission options are limited to "Full Control, View Profile, Edit Profile, View Advancement, Edit Advancement". If a leader holds the position of Scoutmaster or Troop Admin, their connection is set to "Full Control" for every youth in the unit, which enables the leader to edit advancement, edit profiles, etc.

However, for other positions, such as Secretary or Outdoor Coordinator, connection options were limited and did not translate well to the permissions needed to perform the duties of the position. This results in leaders being given connection-based permissions that are either beyond or far less than what they should have, as related to their position.

The change will occur in Scoutbook Plus, where a unit can actively change most registered positions (and functional positions) for adults in their unit. For example, a Chartered Organization Representative may now move an adult's registration from Committee Member registration to Assistant Scoutmaster in Scoutbook Plus. Previously, this action could only be performed in My.Scouting.When assigning leaders to registered or functional positions, these positions will have a base set of permissions, which allows the leader to perform their duties across the full unit or sub-unit.

In addition, leaders may customize and add additional permissions associated with the addigned positions. (So, if a leader is Troop Secretary but also helps out recording advancement, the unit can assign the "Advancement Editor including Youth leadership" permission to perform the additional duty.) Default permissions assigned to positions have been determined by the Guide to Advancement and generally accepted best practices for position functionality. Some permissions may only be granted based on position (i.e., approving adults to serve as leaders is restricted to Chartered Organization Rep, COR/CUR Delegate, and/or Council Unit Representative), while many can be assigned to the individual. 


